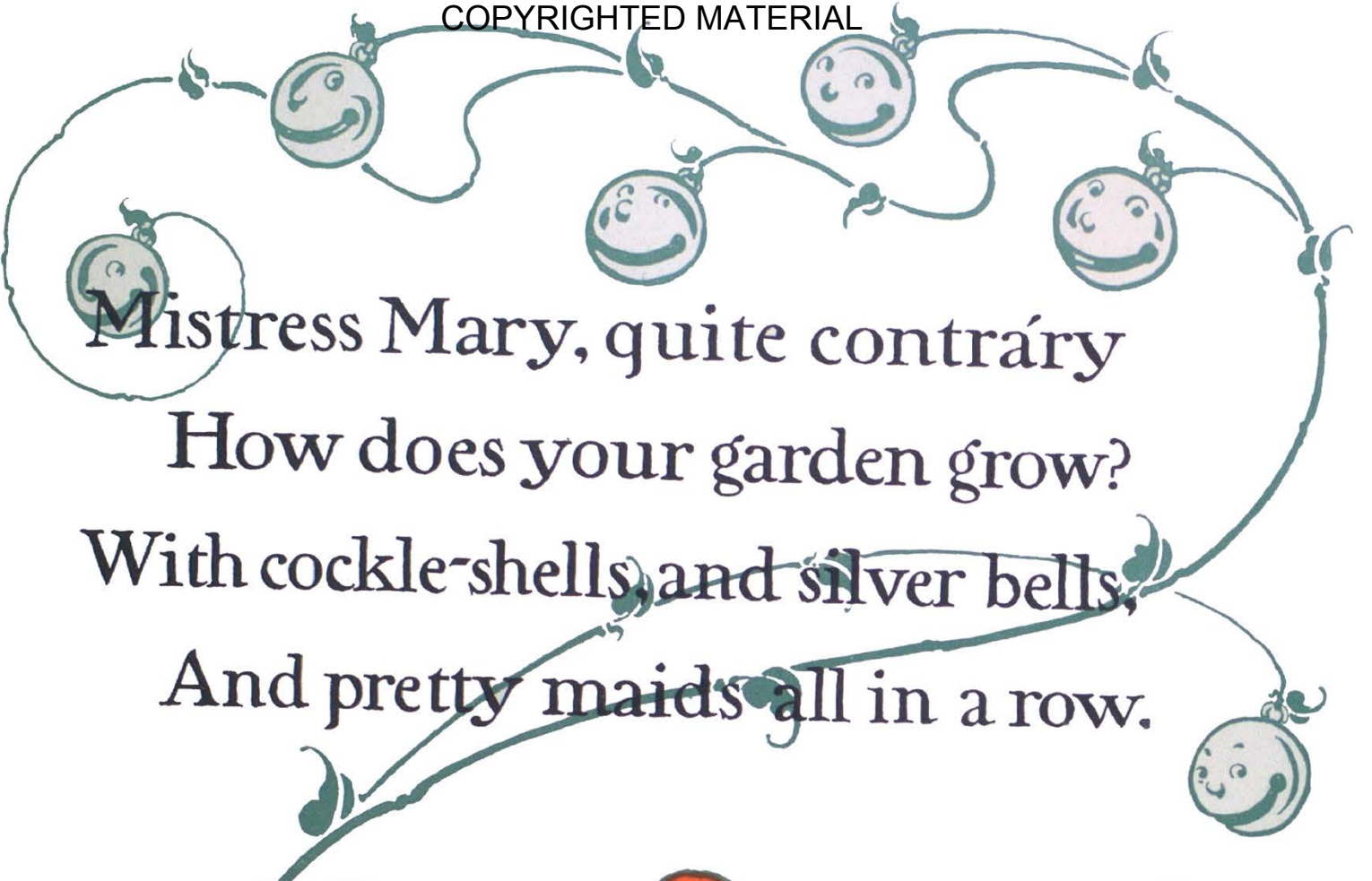

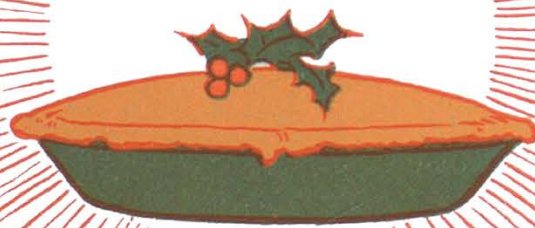


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Little Jack Horner

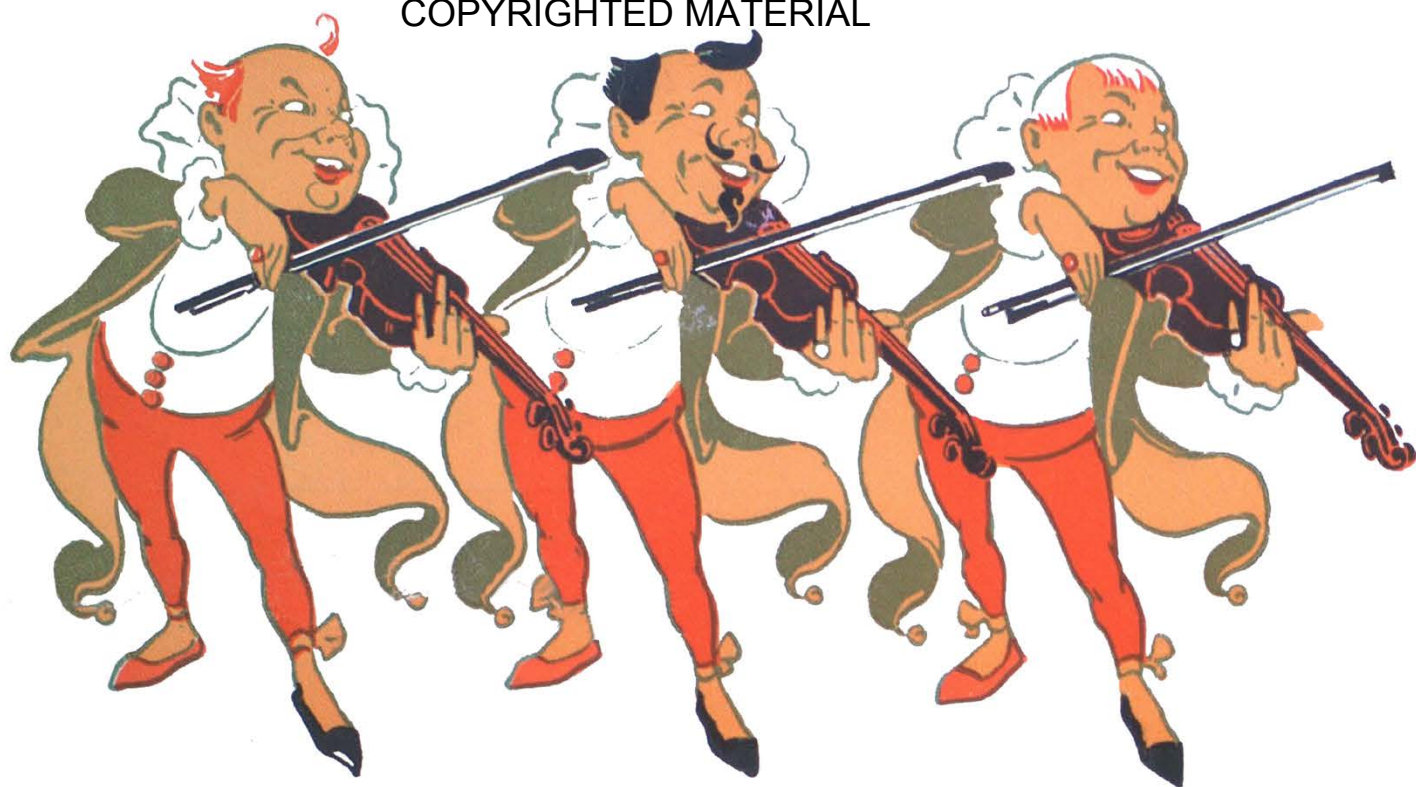


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Old King Cole

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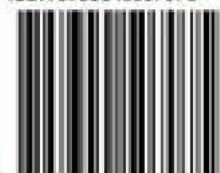
